- **team-based school breaks down large school population into smaller communities for students
 - Each team made of 4 teacher rooms, labeled by color
 - Each teacher teaches 1 subject and homeroom, kids rotate through rooms during the day
 - Kids have individual schedules (they do not move as a homeroom unit)
 - Gifted programming Advanced Language Arts and Math
 - These students go out of the team for those classes but with other students from their respective teams
 - IEP students will be attached to a Special Education teacher that is assigned to respective team.
 - Schedule is biggest change for new students earlier wake ups, lockers, more teachers, etc.
 - Sample schedule includes academics in the morning, specials in the afternoon, end of day with flex time (focus is reading/math for most kids)
 - Specials more variety (band, orchestra, choir, multimedia, general music, art, computer science, and advanced options that require tryouts).
- Electronic Course Selector
 - Will be available on 5/11. The selector includes ranks and specials.
 Most students get all requests. More information coming home through the S'more, BB Connect and through Elementary Schools.
 - Selector will be used for 6th graders as well.
- Clubs and Activities
 - Activity brochure included on the website. Includes a wide variety of interests such as athletics, coding, tech, and chess.
 - All activities will begin after the start of school.
- PTO
 - Involvement encouraged on the board as well as a volunteer
 - Openings for new board members and the PTO would love to have representation from our Symmes community.

Principal & Assistant Principal Report

- 2 initiatives

- Aviation Station 3rd visit scheduled for the week after spring break. Focus will be on robotics.
- STEAM Day first annual event scheduled for 4/25. It will run a lot like Grandparents Day. All parents will be invited and students will be doing various experiments.
- School safety
 - Doors locked all doors are locked before school and after school. Arrangements must be made for access for all after school programs.
 - Window punches included in classroom emergency bags. Teachers have had training on how to properly use them (ALICE safety training).

- o District communication safety video posted on the website
 - Elementary level students are trained to follow the teacher for instructions in an emergency as they are too young to make their own safety decisions.
 - Reunification location is Blue Ash Rec Center for all the district (open 24/7).
- Classroom doors are to be locked during the school day. This prevents fumbling to lock them in emergency. Our doors have magnets that prevent the door from closing completely, which limits disruptions during the school day. It is then much easier to remove the magnet quickly for a locked door in the event of an emergency.
- Lobby Guard to be installed after spring break. It scans driver's licenses, does a background check (for sexual offenders) and prints ID badges with pictures.
- MAP testing scheduled for the week before spring break.
- Staffing changes Jill Evans will be relocating to Kansas, and Cathy Ashton is retiring.
- Recycling bins located in the Symmes parking lot. There is a contest for the most material collected and Symmes is currently in the lead. Winner will get a trophy.
